bargaining with God

Genesis 18:17-33

Many characters in the Old Testament spoke with God face-to-face: Moses, Jacob, even Solomon. Abraham also spoke to God in His presence. Abraham's conversation with Him shows something about how God involves His people to pray for others.

Read Genesis 18:17-19.

☐ What does God's question and response say about His relationship with Abraham?

Verses 20 and 21 show God's plan to destroy the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah.

☐ Why does this have to happen?

The next few verses are a "negotiating" conversation between Abraham and God.

Read verses 22-33, and then try to put yourself in Abraham's position, considering God's position of authority.

 $\hfill\Box$ Do you think it's possible to talk God out of something?

 $\hfill\Box$ What happened as the result of Abraham's prayer?

Genesis 18:17-33

¹⁷Then the Lord said, "Shall I hide from Abraham what I am about to do? ¹⁸Abraham will surely become a great and powerful nation, and all nations on earth will be blessed through him. ¹⁹For I have chosen him, so that he will direct his children and his household after him to keep the way of the Lord by doing what is right and just, so that the Lord will bring about for Abraham what he has promised him."

²⁰Then the LORD said, "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great and their sin so grievous ²¹that I will go down and see if what they have done is as bad as the outcry that has reached me. If not, I will know,"

²²The men turned away and went toward Sodom, but Abraham remained standing before the Lorp. ²³Then Abraham approached him and said: "Will you sweep away the righteous with the wicked? ²⁴What if there are fifty righteous people in the city? Will you really sweep it away and not spare the place for the sake of the fifty righteous people in it? ²⁵Far be it from you to do such a thing—to kill the righteous with the wicked, treating the righteous and the wicked alike. Far be it from you! Will not the Judge of all the earth do right?"

²⁶The Lord said, "If I find fifty righteous people in the city of Sodom, I will spare the whole place for their sake."

²⁷Then Abraham spoke up again: "Now that I have been so bold as to speak to the Lord, though I am nothing but dust and ashes, ²⁸what if the number of the righteous is five less than fifty? Will you destroy the whole city because of five people?"

"If I find forty-five there," he said, "I will not destroy it."

²⁹Once again he spoke to him, "What if only forty are found there?"

He said, "For the sake of forty, I will not do it."

³⁰Then he said. "May the Lord not be angry, but let me speak. What if only thirty can be found there?"

He answered, "I will not do it if I find thirty there."
³¹Abraham said, "Now that I have been so bold as to speak to the Lord, what if only twenty can be

found there?"

He said, "For the sake of twenty, I will not destroy
it."

³²Then he said, "May the Lord not be angry, but let me speak just once more. What if only ten can be found there?"

He answered, "For the sake of ten, I will not destroy it."

³³When the Lord had finished speaking with Abraham, he left, and Abraham returned home



» mon

In this verse, young Timothy is reminded by his tutor, Paul, to "first of all" remember prayer. If prayer was your first priority today, what would you ask of God?

We can get in the middle of people's problems and help them out by praying for them. Who can you be an intercessor for this week? Pray for them now.

»thurs

A wise Christian always focuses (or points) toward God. What can happen if we don't? Take a look at 1 Timothy 1:18-20. How does prayer help us focus on God?

»fri

Perseverance is another word for endurance, toughness, and staving power. Ask God to give you patience when you face obstacles as you get in step with the Spirit.

»sat


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"Everyone must attend school!"
