#### At This Age

Many two year olds like the change of scenery travel brings. Here are some tips to help your child not become overstimulated or unconfortable:

- Every couple of hours, let your child stretch his legs—stop the car and take him out of the car seat, stand up in the airplane, etc.
- After a few hours, redirect your child's interest with special toys and munchies.
- Let your child carry a favorite toy or blanket while traveling. The familiarity will help him cope with the changes.
- Stay as close to your child's routine as possible.

# Time with your Tooldler

### Paul Was God's Helper based on Acts 13:2-6; 16:6

This week's Bible story is "Paul Was God's Helper." Toddlers like and need repetition to learn—so read the story many times during the week.



(Spread arms one at a time.)

Everywhere Paul went he told people about Jesus.

(Cup hands around mouth.)

Sometimes he took a boat. Sometimes he walked.

(Walk in place.)

Paul told people how much God loved them.

Paul was God's helper.

(Point up.)

These questions can be used to help your child review the Bible story.

- 1. Who was Paul? (God's helper)
- 2. Who was God's helper? (Paul)
