- Keep the road your first priority. If your child becomes extremely fussy or angry, pull over to a safe location before dealing with your child.

Wise Men Came to See Jesus

based on Matthew 2:1-12

The Bible story "Wise Men Came to See Jesus" was taught in Sunday school today. Read the story from here and Bible storybooks many times—toddlers like and need repetition to learn.

Wise men saw a great big star. (Hold hands above eyes and look up.)

The wise men followed the star. (Walk in place.)

The star helped the wise men find Jesus with Mary. (Point up.)

The wise men bowed down to Jesus. (Bow head.)

The wise men gave gifts to Jesus. (Hold arms out in front of you.)

Wise men came to see Jesus. (Hold hands above eyes.)

These questions can be used to help your child review the Bible story.

- 1. Who came to see Jesus? (The wise men)
- 2. Who did the wise men see? (Jesus)
