

Time with your Toddler

I'm Happy Because God Loves Me

based on Luke 19:1-6

The Bible story "I'm Happy Because God Loves Me" was taught in Sunday school today. Read the story from here and Bible storybooks many times—toddlers like and need repetition to learn.



(Hold hand low to the ground.)

So Zacchaeus climbed a tree to see Jesus. (Put one hand over the other and repeat.)

Jesus loved Zacchaeus. He said, "Zacchaeus, come down!" (Hug self; put both arms up in the air and slowly bring down.)

Zacchaeus was happy God loved him. I'm happy because God loves me!

(Hug self.)

These questions can be used to help your child review the Bible story.

- 1. Who loved Zacchaeus? (Jesus)
- 2. Who does God love? (Me)
