
Jacob Choose to Get Along

1. Esau had been born a few minutes ahead of Jacob. Their father wanted Esau to be in charge of the family. One day Jacob saw Esau go hunting.




When Esau came back, he learned that Jacob had tricked their dad. Now Jacob was in charge. Esau was angry, and Jacob ran far away.






About It

Help Jacob get to the animals he sent ahead to Esau. Then help Esau get to the same place.








